Event Summary (from Tony Cooley):

- 0700 – I arrived and set up our First Aid station outside the Health Cabin at Camp Arrowhead. The event organizers were very excited to have us there. Michelle and Ashley Jeter arrived shortly after 7:00.
- 0830 – Finally got the Health Cabin unlocked. Moved gear inside, but we continued to sit outside so people knew we were there.
- 0900 – First customer – 11 year-old girl with nosebleed. Very light flow. No signs of weakness or altered consciousness. Supplied a gauze pad and instructions.

- 1155 – Second customer – 6 year-old girl with slight abrasion on top of middle toe on right foot. Her brother had dropped his tomahawk on it. Cleaned and applied bandaid.
- 1200 – Departed site, leaving Michelle and Ashley to man the station.
- 11 year old girl was injured. She had fallen and had a slight abrasion to her ankle on her right foot. Ashley cleaned her wound and applied a band-aid. (per Shelle Jeter)

Overall I think this was a very successful event. We were very near the registration area and most folks passed by us multiple times during the event. We sat out front and greeted people all morning. By noon, they had registered over 1000 people and there were at least 100 volunteers, so we were seen by a lot of folks. If we're invited next year, I'll volunteer again. I think next year we should bring an awning and table (and maybe the trailer) so we can be even more effective with outreach. (per Tony)
